**Note regarding prorating to Institutes and Centers (ICs):**

Both House and Senate stimulus bills direct prorating to ICs per the NIH funding in the Fiscal Year (FY) 2009 Labor, Health and Human Services, and Education (LHHS) appropriations bill, which has yet to be finalized. The prorated research amount to ICs is absent additional funds that researchers could receive from the common fund (e.g., bridge funding, young innovator awards) and from the extramural facility instrumentation/repair funds.
